SNAP Benefits:

SNAP stands for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

- To apply for food assistance, Medicaid, and/or cash assistance, or to manage your benefits and receive information, visit <https://www.myflorida.com/accessflorida/>
- At the request of Governor DeSantis, and in accordance with the federal Families First Coronavirus Act, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) will waive work requirements for individuals participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program.

Helpful Resources

WIC Program:

WIC stands for the Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children.

WIC is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered in Florida by the Department of Health.

- You must be a pregnant woman, or a woman who has recently been pregnant, a breastfeeding mother, an infant, or a child under five years of age;
- You must meet certain [income guidelines](#).
- You must live in Florida.
- You must have a nutrition-related need, which will be determined by WIC staff.
